




#### Parents By Gender: Quality of Public Schools




### Parents By Party ID: Quality of Public Schools



### Parents By Age: Quality of Public Schools




### Parents By Area: Quality of Public Schools







### Required Testing Subjects


Do you think there is a correlation between




### Required Testing Subjects










### Required Testing Subjects

In recent years, MA students have performed very well on national and international English, math and science tests. But in national competitions that test knowledge of US history, MA students have never finished among the top 10 states.




### US History Graduation Requirement

When the commissioner and Board of Elementary and Secondary Education postponed the US history graduation requirement in 2009, they cited the \$2.4 million annual cost of administering the test.










### Parents, Legislators More Bullish, Teachers Less So

#### Conclusions

- > Parents, teachers, & legislators give high marks to education in MA
- > Students should study U.S. history > 85% to 100%
- $\triangleright$  More focus on history needed  $\rightarrow$  80% to 96%
- > Strong correlation between testing and outcomes
- > 56%-68% support history MCAS to graduate
- ➤ There is money in the MA state budget to administer this test (\$2.4 million) → 88%
