

340B in Nevada

Key Points

- ▶ Nevada's low-income taxpayers are required to utilize for-profit pharmacies in Florida.
- ▶ PBM owned pharmacy has the most number of contracts benefiting from a federal program intended to support needy Nevada taxpayers.
- ▶ 49% of the contract pharmacies intended to serve poor patients in Nevada are located in affluent neighborhoods.
- ▶ Nevada 340B hospitals (1.25%) provide less charity care than the national average (2.15%).

18% of 340B contract pharmacies for the top Nevada hospitals with the most contract pharmacies are based outside the state. Some of the pharmacies are in Florida.

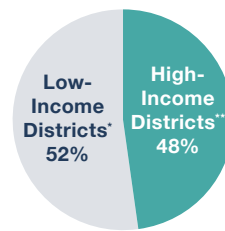
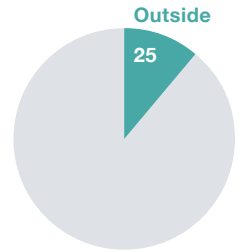

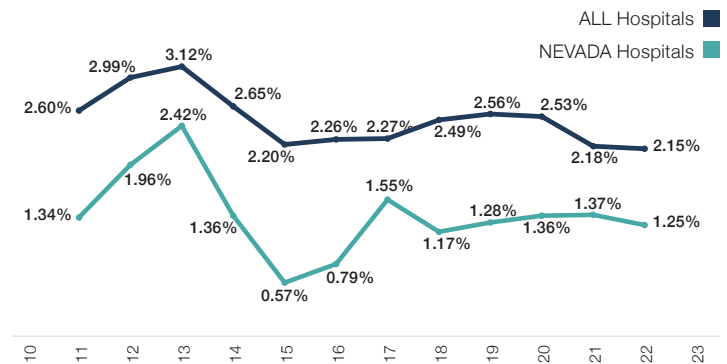


48% of 340B pharmacies supposedly serving the poor are in affluent neighborhoods in Nevada.
