

# 340B in Oregon

## Key Points

- ▶ Oregon's low-income taxpayers are required to utilize for-profit pharmacies in Florida.
- ▶ For profit chain drug stores have the most number of contracts benefiting from federal program intended to support needy Oregon taxpayers.
- ▶ 49% of contract pharmacies intended to serve poor patients in Oregon are located in affluent neighborhoods.
- ▶ Oregon 340B hospitals (1.86%) provide less charity care than the national average (2.15%).

**43% of 340B contract pharmacies for the Oregon hospitals with the most contract pharmacies are based outside the state.**

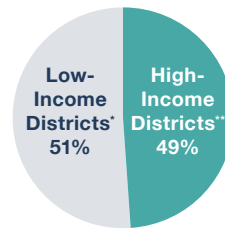
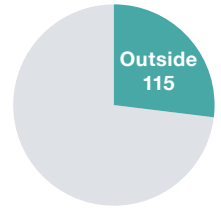

**Top Oregon hospital with the highest operating expenses eligible for 340B discounts provide less charity care than the state and national averages.**

- Total number of contract pharmacies intended to serve needy patients in Oregon – **423**
- Number of contract pharmacies intended to serve Oregon's needy patients that are located outside of Oregon – **115**



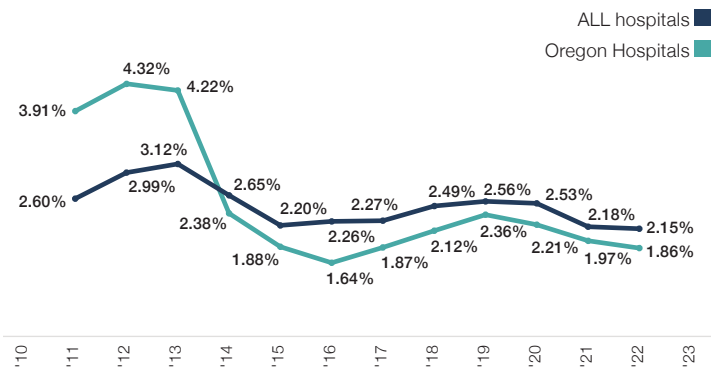
**49% of the 340B pharmacies supposedly serving the poor are in affluent neighborhoods in Oregon.**

- **12.2%** of the population living in poverty

\* **Low-Income Districts:** house districts where the percentage of the population living in poverty is above the average state poverty percentage

\*\* **High-Income Districts:** house districts where the percentage of the population living in poverty is below the average state poverty percentage
